### **Training Nights**

Thursday evening remains our main "club night" at the Dolphin Swimming Pool.

Pool training sessions are "held" every Thursday evening throughout the year (including school holidays accept Easter Week and Christmas Week when we have a break.

The evening is now divided into two main sessions:

**Session 1: 7.30pm to 9.00pm** - caters for the Rookie section. Rookies normally start at 7.30pm for a dry Theory / Life Support session followed by a pool session from 8.00pm to 9.00pm.

**Session 2: 8.00pm to 10.15pm** - This caters for rookies of a slightly older age group and covers a variety of swimming awards including training towards Survive and Save and other pool awards and dry side Theory/Life Support for junior and senior members.

Training in Lifesaving, Lifeguarding and Life Support skills are given to members both in the swimming pool and in open water at Sandbanks.

Open water training sessions are organised on an alternative evening (Tuesdays) and weekends during the summer months.

Examinations are regularly undertaken for RLSS / SLSA / RYA awards.

Training is also provided in first aid, power boat handling, paddle craft, radio communications and other associated topics throughout the year.

### **Training Courses**

If you're interested in any of our courses then please contact our Training Officers, either via email at **training@rlss-poole.org.uk**, or come along to the Dolphin Swimming Pool, Thursdays between 7.30pm and 8pm and introduce yourself to the membership secretary who is usually found sitting at a table in the foyer. Alternatively you can visit the club website for more info and e-mail: **info@rlss-poole.org.uk**.

For those existing club members who wish to develop their skills as a trainer the club provides training bursaries. These bursaries can cover life saving, life guarding and boat handling instructor courses.



### Membership

RLSS Poole Lifeguard is open to anyone aged 9 years and above. There is an annual subscription fee which is renewable by the end of December each year. The membership year runs from the 1<sup>st</sup> January to 31<sup>st</sup> December.

We offer four categories of membership: Senior, Junior, Family and Supporter:-

- A Senior Member is one who is 18 years of age or over.
- A Junior Member less than 18 years of age
- A Family Membership consists of 3 or more family members living at the same address; max of 2 adults. Children are considered to be under 18 and in full time education.
- The Supporter membership is for non active members (e.g. parents and friends).

New members are always welcome, but are reminded that the objective of RLSS Poole Lifeguard is to provide lifeguards to keep Sandbanks Beach safe.

#### Cost

The cost of the Membership for 2015 remained the same. It was agreed by the executive committee not to increase again for the 2016 year. Specifically:

The weekly swim fee for those paying cash on a club night remains £3. This has remained the same since 2013. This is to encourage members to pay by monthly standing order where the fee remains the same as last year at a fee of £7.50 per month.

### 2015 Officers' Annual Reports

### **President's Report**

The year of 2015 was the fortieth anniversary of the founding of RLSS Poole Lifeguard Club and it was an absolutely amazing year for the club with some of the usual ups and downs. I believe as you read through this report you will agree that the club has met its aim and objectives.

The club provided safety cover at various open water swimming throughout the 2015 summer season such as the Swanage Triathlon, The Sea Horse swim, The Global swim series and of course The Brownsea Island swim. The club is regularly contacted to provide advice to others regarding safety cover for events. The club also assists with safety cover for smaller events and open water training sessions. The club provides a truly professional service at the same time as involving our younger members, thus giving them a valuable opportunity to develop important life saving skills and the chance to see how they can make a difference.

As a club we are extremely fortunate to have a number of truly dedicated individuals who work for the benefit of others by promoting the club within our community, providing training within our wider community relating to drowning prevention and save a baby's life. Such dedication has been recognised by club members receiving seventeen national RLSS UK honours. I am very pleased for Mark Shakles who received The Stan Beck Trophy (awarded to the person who the RLSS UK feels does the most to carry out the objectives of the Society in their local area) and a second bar to his RLSS Service Cross and Irene Pemberton and Stuart Archer who both received their RLSS Service Medal. A number of members received RLSS certificates of Merit and or Thanks and Lara Moore was awarded the Wessex Region Young Life Saver of the Year Award for 2014.

The club has always prided its self in the way it supports and encourages its members, especially our younger members. Several of our younger members assist with the delivery of the RLSS Rookie training programme, which provides them with greater understanding of the society and the various skills required to being competent lifesavers. It also allows them to understand the individual needs and requirements of the young people they are training and to appreciate we are all different. This is something our past President John Howes who we sadly lost last year knew only too well. He spent a considerable amount of his life dedicated to supporting and developing young people and being involved with a local charity My Time which is dedicated to providing support for young carers. The annual club sponsored swim raised over £800.00 for this very worthy charity.

One of the high lights in the club's annual calendar must be the Brownsea swim. Again the swim was oversubscribed and the event was superbly organised with Mark Shakles being the club lead. This event requires the club to work in partnership with the various clubs across the bay, the John Lewis Partnership and the National Trust. On the day there are around one hundred volunteers providing safety cover, registering swimmers and collating results. It is a massive undertaking, which on the day runs so smoothly. Those completing the swim can use the event to raise money for charities of their own choice. In 2015 over

£23,000.00 was pledged to either national or local charities.

I was so pleased that in this anniversary year a number of our club member's entered the RLSS UK National Life Saving Championships. I must congratulate Sam Harrison, George Kennedy, Emma Marjason and Sophie Torok who were successful at the Wessex Region and Southern Branch heats and qualified for the National finals, with Sam Harrison and George Kennedy winning the rope throw element of the competition. They have clearly been an inspiration to others as twelve club members entered the RLSS National Speed competition.

It is impossible to thank everyone individually who supports RLSS Poole Lifeguard club but I must thank the Borough of Poole. The Royal Motor Yacht Club and The Oaks Nursery who support us on a daily basis. I must also thank all of our members, those who provide training and safety cover and to all members of the executive committee who give so much.

- •We have had 12 Rookies signed up for the 2016 Speed competition.

### **Training - Community Cohesion Training**

#### **BROWNSEA ISLAND SWIM 2015**

Once another truly again, wonderful Brownsea Island Swim, the weather held up beautifully and the wind against tide made for an extremely tough swim on the back half of the island, right into the finish funnel. It was certainly a much talked about topic bν swimmers on the finish line whilst getting their breath back and recovering.



No one said it would be easy and after all the Swim T-Shirts do state "Brownsea Island Challenge", well guess what – it lived up to it this year.

Although 300 swimmers were on the start list, 13 failed to show which I have to say is disappointing, as there were swimmers still on the reserve list who would have loved to have had the opportunity. That a side, it meant that 287 started the swim, which saw some extremely fast flowing spring tides at the start line. Despite the extremely challenging conditions only two swimmers did not complete their distance, so all in all a tremendous achievement all round.

As is customary with each swim now, we do encourage the swimmers to use the event to generate sponsorship for a charity of their own choosing. This year a staggering £23124.00 has been pledged to a large number of charities, which in itself is an amazing achievement and makes the hard work that goes into organising the whole event even more worthwhile. A list of all the charities that will be benefit from the 2015 swim is shown at the bottom of this article.

As with every Brownsea Swim, we have to give a big shout out to all the Marshals, the Guys and Girls in the safety boats and on the paddle craft without whom, the event would not take place. There were 35 marshals, 54 paddlers 12 safety boats with at least 2 crew in each one, plus the Half Swim Finish Team, add all that up and you have over 100 people who gave up there time to enable the swim to take place.
