## Club Aim

- To preserve or assist in the preservation of life at sea on the foreshore of Sandbanks Peninsula and Poole Harbour.

## Club Objectives

- Upon request to assist in the preservation of life at other locations throughout the year.
- To promote the development of lifeguard training and expertise.
- To arrange and promote lectures, demonstrations, and competitions and to form classes of instruction, to bring about a widespread and thorough knowledge of the principles that underlie the arts of swimming and lifesaving.
- To promote awareness of the Club and the RLSS-UK to a high level.



# Training Nights

Thursday evening remains our main "club night" at the Dolphin Swimming Pool.

Pool training sessions are "held" every Thursday evening throughout the year (including school holidays except Easter Week and Christmas Week when we have a break.

The evening is now divided into two main sessions:

**Session 1: 7.00pm to 8.45pm** - caters for the Rookie section. Rookies normally start at 7.00pm for a dry Theory / Life Support session followed by a pool session from 7.30pm to 8.30pm.

**Session 2: 8.00pm to 9.45pm** - This caters for rookies of a slightly older age group and covers a variety of swimming awards including training towards Survive and Save and other pool awards and dry side Theory/Life Support for junior and senior members.

Training in Lifesaving, Lifeguarding and Life Support skills are given to members both in the swimming pool and in open water at Sandbanks.

Open water training sessions are organised on an alternative evening (Tuesdays) and weekends during the summer months.

Examinations are regularly undertaken for RLSS / SLSA / RYA awards.

Training is also provided in first aid, power boat handling, paddle craft, radio communications and other associated topics throughout the year.

For those existing club members who wish to develop their skills as a trainer the club provides training bursaries. These bursaries can cover life saving, life guarding and boat handling instructor courses.



# Membership

RLSS Poole Lifeguard is open to anyone aged 9 years and above. There is an annual subscription fee which is renewable by the end of December each year. The membership year runs from the 1<sup>st</sup> of January to 31<sup>st</sup> December.

We offer four categories of membership: **Senior, Junior, Family and Supporter**: -

- A Senior Member is one who is 18 years of age or over.
- A Junior Member less than 18 years of age
- A Family Membership consists of 3 or more family members living at the same address; max of 2 adults. Children are under 18 and in full time education.
- The Supporter membership is for non-active members (parents and friends).

New members are always welcome but are reminded that the objective of RLSS Poole Lifeguard is to provide lifeguards to keep Sandbanks Beach safe.

# 2021 Officer's Annual Reports

## President's Report:

The year started with all club activities still suspended due to government restrictions because of Covid-19. Executive Trustee Committee meetings continued to be held via zoom. I still found those attending the meetings to be extremely enthusiastic and optimistic for the future. Plans were discussed and reviewed for when club activities would be allowed to recommence. The Executive decided late in 2020 to allow current members to renew their membership free of charge for 2021 as they had received very little for their 2020 membership.

With the lifting of Covid-19 restrictions the club was able to recommence training activities, following RLSS UK guidance and whilst complying with Everyone Active restrictions on the use of the pool. Training recommenced in mid Spring and continued throughout the year. Special praise must be given to our trainers who delivered the RLSS UK Rookie and Survive and Save programs.

In the past I have stressed how vulnerable the club has been without new volunteers to assist with the running of the club. I was extremely pleased to welcome two new volunteers to the Executive Trustee Committee, Amanda Wise-Hall, and Clare Hawkins. Initially they attended zoom meetings and joined in our discussions, asking questions, and gaining an enhanced understanding and insight to the club. Following discussions with both Amanda and Clare it was decided to co-opt Amada Wise-Hall as Chair and Clare Hawkins as Fund Raising Officer. I still ask that new members or parents volunteer their services to keep the club executive fresh and healthy.

I wish to thank Amanda for finalising the appointment of our three Appointed Trustees, Brian Pemberton, Jill Bailey, and Louise Harrison who provide a governance overview of the club. All three have been involved with the club and lifesaving for many years and have the best interests of the club at heart.

It has been another difficult year financially, with the club dipping into its reserves to keep the club solvent. With reduced income from annual membership, monthly swim fees and donations linked to providing safety cover. The club has operated at a loss of over £8,000.00. Even when all club activities are suspended the club still incurs significant costs relating to insurance, maintenance, and storage of equipment, especially the safety boats. These costs amount to over £7,500.00 and could be significantly reduced if the executive decided not to maintain or insure our assets. Such a decision could question the due diligence of the Executive Trustees. A review of the insurance requirements has been initiated to establish our needs and best value.

The Executive Trustees have increased the annual membership fee for each member category by £5.00 and the monthly swim fees by £1.50 per month for 2022 to assist with rising costs. These fees were last increased several years ago.

The Executive Trustees along with all club members are looking forward to a more settled 2022 where a full training program will be delivered whilst proving safety cover at various events.

It is impossible to thank everyone individually who supports RLSS Poole Lifeguard club, but I must thank the Bournemouth, Christchurch and Poole Council, The Royal Motor Yacht Club and The Oaks Nursery who support us daily. I must also thank all our members, our training team and all members of the executive committee who give so much.

He gave his full support and assisted in the acquisition of the clubs first premises at Sandbanks and continued to provide valuable, support, advice and assistance to the club as a trustee. As a club we will be forever in his debt for the fabulous service and friendship he gave us. He will be greatly missed. Our thoughts go out to both families at such a sad time. The beginning of the year saw COVID-19 restrictions lift and training sessions start once again, albeit smaller groups to accommodate those returning as well as ensuring we operated within the Everyone Active guidelines. Although we had a very promising start to the year, it has not been without challenges as the club's finances were severely hit from not being able to organise the annual Brownsea Island Swim or providing safety cover at a number of water born events. Behind the scenes, our dedicated members, trainers, coxswains, supporters, and partners continued to work tirelessly and selflessly to fund non-contact rescue training aids, provide a consistent uniform for all, produce new risk assessments, update the Safeguarding Policy and Trainers Guidelines as well as provide an outstanding COVID 19 compliant training programme for all age groups. I would like to extend my personal thanks to all those that volunteer and the executive team for their knowledge and support as I try to fill the boots of our wonderful President, David Ayres who became our acting Chair in 2020. Finally, for the club to continue to be successful in upholding its aims and objectives in 2022/2023 we need to see more engagement with parents which will enable enhanced skill sets as well as undertaking RLSS training courses.

## Treasurers Report:

2021 took a huge toll on the club's finances, we were hit hard and at the end of the year we were down by £8179.72 from what we started the year. We are fortunate that we could absorb this, but it is something that we cannot afford to continue doing. This will be the first time the club has recorded a negative cash flow in its history, and it is a reminder of how we need to keep sourcing income revenues to keep the club buoyant.

Yes, there were reasons for us being in deficit, but looking to the future we need to find ways that we can potentially guarantee income, either via a team of people working on grants, or the looking for other revenue sources, but one thing is certain, we want to minimise the cost burden to our own club members.

The reasons for the deficit during 2021 was as a direct impact of the COVID-19 Pandemic and the result of lockdowns during 2020 and 2021.

Membership Fees: As we did not operate very much during 2020, we chose to carry over membership fees from 2020 to 2021.

Monthly Swim Fees: We also had more lockdowns during 2021 and as such we asked members to stop paying their monthly swim fees during these months.

Safety Cover: As we were not able to operate fully, we were unable to provide Safety Cover at various events that we regularly provide cover for.

Brownsea Swim: We were again unable to run our annual event which generates about £4K-£5K per annum income. This was the 2<sup>nd</sup> year it has not run due to the Pandemic.

Unfortunately, our outgoings did NOT get affected by the Pandemic and we had to continue paying for items such Insurance, Equipment Storage and Servicing etc.

Therefore, a big plea to any parents (or members) who are not already active within the club executive, who might feel that they could be a desktop warrior, on our behalf, and actively start looking at online grants and other such applications / sponsorship deal, then please step forward and offer your services. You don't have to sit on the exec if you don't want to, and we would offer all the help we can, to answer questions. It's just that the existing members of the club exec are already overworked, with their exec roles as well as training roles and as such find it difficult to then start looking into grant applications or sponsorship deals.
